INTRODUCTION

In today's world, nurses' role has expanded from tertiary care setting to community settings. Even in Pakistan, nurses are playing critical roles in diversified settings to promote the population's health. The underlying notion is to decrease the burden of disease and increase the quality of people's life to impact on economic stability of the nation. *Thus*, nurses are not confined to hospital settings rather broaden up to the extent and performing various roles as an integral part of the health care team. CHNS IN PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

Primary Health Care (PHC) approach is used in health services organizations to serve the population; and CHNs are integral part of PHC approach. CHNs work at individual, family, and community levels, utilizing population or risk approach. For instance, CHNs works with collaborators and identifies non communicable diseases such as high blood pressure, high cholesterol levels and diabetes mellitus as priority health problems. One of the examples of CHN work is a healthy heart program which is planned to promote community health focusing on healthy lifestyle.
