If not equipped with the correct tools for independent research, this stage can be much more daunting than it should be, creating a need for support systems that guide students during this phase of their academic careers (Glazek et al., 2018; Major, 2023).

The lack of appropriate guidance to maneuver through these academic intricacies can be detrimental. In the case of doctoral students, effective mentorship and organized aid systems are likely to assist them in overcoming challenges relating to writing dissertations (Major, 2023). It has been discovered that students who have access to preparatory classes, workshops, as well as mentorship programs are equipped to handle the intricacies involved in conducting dissertation research (Ciampa & Wolfe, 2019; Vidair et al., 2019). In addition to the skills and knowledge imparted, these students also form a social network that combats the sense of loneliness and increases motivation ("Virtual Dissertation Circles: Student Engagement Strategies and Lessons Learned", 2022). Moreover, students' experiences with dissertation writing get better with the availability of knowledgeable advisors who inform them of the academic environment and improve their experience with the transition from classes to research (Dericks et al., 2019; Maul et al., 2018).

This chapter is designed to help PhD students and their supervisors grasp the fundamental elements of dissertation research. By identifying the key stages of work on a dissertation, this work attempts to clarify the process and suggest practical solutions towards its completion. Students should realize that the dissertation is not only an academic hurdle that they need to jump through to get their degree, it is an avenue to add value to their area of specialization.
