The Teaching Games for Understanding (TGfU) approach signifies a paradigm shift in physical education by emphasizing an inquiry-based methodology that prioritizes decision-making and tactical understanding through gameplay rather than traditional skill development (Gil-Arias, 2021). Developed in response to the limitations identified in conventional teaching methods, TGfU encourages students to immerse themselves in-game scenarios, fostering a deeper understanding of the underlying principles and strategies inherent to various sports. This experiential learning process enhances cognitive engagement and promotes a stronger connection to the activity, as students actively engage in problem-solving and critical thinking within the game's context. TGfU can increase the motivation of those who have lost interest in specific sports (Barquero-Ruiz, 2021).

Central to TGfU are its core principles, which emphasize teaching tactical understanding before skill execution (García-Castejón et al., 2021). By prioritizing the 'why' behind game actions, students gain insight into the strategic aspects of play, leading to more informed decision-making during the game itself. This contrasts with traditional methods that often focus on repetitive skill drills without context, which can result in disengagement and a diminished appreciation for the game's nuances (Gaspar et al., 2021). TGfU encourages students to experience and explore games in their entirety, allowing them to develop a comprehensive understanding that integrates both tactics and skills. This approach not only makes learning more enjoyable but also fosters adaptable players who can think critically and respond effectively to dynamic game situations.

TGfU addresses key shortcomings found in conventional physical education methods. Traditional strategies often emphasize technical skills through disconnected drills, which can result in students losing interest due to a lack of context and enjoyment. In comparison, TGfU adopts a more comprehensive approach that combines play and strategy, significantly boosting student engagement. By placing students in real game situations, TGfU encourages active involvement and interest, making the learning experience more relevant and enjoyable. Additionally, this approach enhances tactical awareness, helping students gain a deeper comprehension of game strategies and decision-making processes essential for successful sports performance.

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
