## **INTRODUCTION**

Religious tourism is a particular type of heritage tourism that focuses on spiritual significance. Subsequently, “religious tourism,” “faith tourism,” and “spiritual tourism” are the synonym terms that are used interchangeably. Religious tourism, or rather faith tourism as it is sometimes referred to, is travel that is done in order to practice or advance one’s religion (Singh et al. 2025). Such individuals are engaged in a form of travel known as ‘spiritual tourism’ which may be viewed as a type of cultural tourism. Religious tourism includes visiting temples, mosques, churches, monasteries, and pilgrimage routes associated with various faiths (Bhardwaj, 1973). In today’s world almost all governments and public institutions understand the potential of promoting spiritual tourism and on that basis, develop and support the entrepreneurial initiatives in this area. Such initiatives and their goals, ways of their execution and problems that they face, are analyzed in this chapter. This chapter take Mathura, Prayagraj, Kashi and Ayodhya as case example for study. It also shows that religious tourism is not homogeneous, and spans from simple praying and retreating to the historical practice of travel to the sites of interest and attendance of local rituals and events (Collins-Kreiner, 2010). It considers the convergence of business practices with religious tourism where it is demonstrated that business projects may enhance the development and enrich the diversity of religious tourism (Singh & Agrawal, 2019).
