Integrative Health

The National Center for Complementary and Integrative Health (NCCIH) define it as a practice that reaffirms the importance of the relationship between practitioner and patient, focuses on the whole person, is informed by evidence, and makes use of all appropriate therapeutic approaches to achieve optimal health and healing (NCCIH, 2018). Let us break that down:

- **It is NOT alternative medicine:**

Integrative health does not *replace* conventional medical treatment. It works *with* it. The medications, therapies, and advice from your loved one's medical team are the primary foundation of their care.

- **It is complementary:**
